

Basic Rules for the games

DAAB expects that any of the following will be upheld and followed by any individual that enters the stadium. We expect that:

- 2 x 20 minute half games will be played
- The game is to be played with a size 6 basketball
- All players must follow the uniform policies implemented
- At Mullum Mullum Stadium, the white three-point line will be used
- Clock Stops in the last 1 minute of the second half of all games on all whistles
- No Time-outs in the last 3 minutes of the first half. (players to be on court)
- Division 4 and 5 will use the small black line closest to the basket for their free -throws
- Divisions 3 and higher will use the standard free throw line that divides the circle at the top of the key
- “Mainstream” players are included in teams throughout the competition to provide a mentor roll on the court and support the coach
- Players must play a minimum of 5 games to be eligible for finals within the team they are allocated
- If a team has 3 players or less, the clock will start and a forfeit will be declared after 5 minutes if a fourth player hasn’t arrived for that team.
- Grading season will run for the first 6 weeks at the beginning of every season – please refer to Grading Policy
- Teams may be subject to change during grading season – please refer to Team Selection Policy
- Officials, coaches and competition organisers will follow and implement the Climate Policy
- Registrations must be paid prior to the commencement of a new season, if unpaid, players are ineligible to play until registration is completed.
- Photos and/or videos will be taken throughout the competition for promotional, social media and All Abilities purposes.
- All players, coaches, spectators, officials and committee members will adhere to their individual and the overall Code of Conduct
- If a player receives a Technical Foul or Unsportsmanlike foul, that player will be subject to the “**Sin Bin**” rule where they must stay on the bench for 3 minutes of the game clock

If you fail to abide by the Code of Conduct set out by Doncaster All Abilities Basketball Competition (DAAB). You will be subject to disciplinary action that may include but not limit to:

- A verbal warning
- A written warning
- Having to stand before the DAAB tribunal
- Suspension from DAAB
- Game forfeit (for incidents involving players or coaches)
- Expulsion from DAAB
